What to expect at your first visit with the Cell Therapy team

On your first visit:

- You will get to know the people who will prepare you for your CAR T-cell therapy
- Your Cell Therapy team will learn about your health
- You will learn about the CAR T- cell therapy process and create a treatment plan
- You may sign your consent forms

Inpatient or Outpatient CAR T-cell therapy

- Inpatient CAR T-cell therapy is when you get your treatment at the hospital and stay overnight for 1 to 2 weeks
- Outpatient CAR T-cell therapy is when you visit the Day Hospital during the day for treatment and checkups and then you sleep at home
- Your Cell Therapy team will decide what type of CAR T-cell therapy (inpatient or outpatient) is best for you

Pre-treatment tests and your consent visit

- You will have medical tests called "safety checks" before your CAR T-cell therapy. Safety checks make sure your body is ready for treatment
- At your consenting appointment, you will decide if you want to have your CAR T-cell therapy
- Bring a family member or friend to your consenting appointment

How you can start preparing for your CAR T-cell therapy

- You must have a caregiver for CAR T-cell therapy
- Getting ready for your CAR T-cell therapy can help you feel better during and after your treatment.
- To get ready for your transplant, you can prepare your body, your mind, and your paperwork
